





Innisfree School Growing with Net Zero

Exciting things are in the planning stages for Innisfree School for the 2022/23 school year & this includes a Net Zero Greenhouse! Innisfree School was the recipient of the A+ Energy Grant from Inside Education. Preference is given to schools that demonstrate measurable greenhouse gas emissions reductions & student engagement. Innisfree was 1 of 21 winners from across Alberta.

Below is the submitted from the Inside Education Website THE FUTURE OF FOOD: A SUSTAINABLE APPROACH | \$5,000

We are building a net zero greenhouse that will not only educate students, but also the surrounding community about renewable sources of energy. We want to introduce the community to the idea of solar power and how easy and effective it can be to use as well as how to use solar power to reduce our ecological footprint. Students will research how far food travels before reaching our small rural community and discuss how their ecological footprint can be reduced by growing food in our net zero greenhouse. The fruits and vegetables that we will be growing will be enjoyed by both the students and the community, to help cut down on the amount of non-renewable energy that is required to get our food from field to fork. We will host community farmers markets where we can sell our local produce and other locally made products, as well as have students give presentations about our greenhouse to educate and inform our community about how they can reduce their ecological footprint. To wrap up the project, students will reevaluate their ecological footprint after incorporating the locally grown and sourced products from our market. We will present our findings at a school assembly, at a parent council meeting, and at a town council meeting.

We are so excited to start this project in August & students will have the opportunity to build the greenhouse in our new woodworking shop!



- Some plants and herbs naturally deter cats by giving off smells that cats dislike, including Rue, Lavender, Pennyroyal, Lemongrass, Coleus and Citronella.
 - There are numerous types of cat repellent sprays and granules, which can be purchased at many hardware stores.
 - Water is an effective repellent. Gently spraying or splashing water on a cat is a useful method for keeping them away.
 - Remove any food sources that may be attracting cats into your yard. Ensure garbage / compost bins are securely shut. Bury chicken wire in the soil in the flower beds that you especially don't want cats to enter.
- While property owners can take steps to deter cats from their yards, bear in mind you cannot, under law, do anything to harm the animal.

RAISIN WALNUT COFFEE CAKE

Ingredients:

2 ½ cups all purpose flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

2 cups chopped walnuts

34 cup brown sugar

½ tsp cinnamon

½ cup raisins

1 cup white sugar

1 cup unsalted butter

3 eggs

2 tsp pure vanilla extract

1 cup sour cream

Directions:

- -Heat oven to 375 degrees F.
- -Butter an angel food cake pan.
- -In medium bowl stir together flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt.
- -In small bowl combine chopped walnuts, brown sugar and cinnamon. Transfer half of this mix to another bowl and mix in raisins.
- -Using mixer on medium beat white sugar and butter for 2 min. Beat in eggs one at a time then vanilla.
- -On low speed mix in flour mixture until just combined.
- -Add sour cream and mix until just combined. (Batter should be very thick.)
- -Spread half the batter evenly into prepared pan and sprinkle with raisin-walnut mixture. Top with remaining batter and sprinkle with walnut mixture.
- -Bake at 375 for 30 mins then reduce oven temp to 300 degrees F and continue baking till wooden pick comes out clean. Approx 20 to 25 mins.
- -Cool cake completely in pan on wire rack.

BUTTERMILK BLUEBERRY/CRANBERRY CAKE

Ingredients:

½ C Unsalted Butter

Zest of large lemon

1 C sugar (set aside 1 T for

sprinkling)

1 Egg, room temp

1 tsp vanilla

2 C Flour (hold back ¼ C of

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp salt

1 cup frozen blueberries 1 cup frozen cranberries (or fresh) (You can use 2


cups total of either fruit if you don't have both)

½ C Buttermilk

Directions:

-Grease 8 inch square pan.

- -Oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter, lemon zest and sugar until light and fluffy.
- -Add egg and vanilla beat till combined. Toss fruit with the 1/4
- -Whisk together remaining flour, salt and baking powder.
- -Add ½ the flour mixture to the batter and stir with spatula to incorporate.
- -Add all the buttermilk and stir. Add rest of flour and stir till absorbed.
- -Fold in the fruit.
- -Spread into greased pan and sprinkle with the tablespoon
- -Bake for 35 to 45 mins. Could take 50 mins. Cool.
- -Mix lemon juice with icing sugar for a glaze to pour over cooled cake. Serve with whipping cream.

So naturally somewhere along the way we acquired a white picket fence, okay in actuality it is a 320 foot long, white two-board fence that runs along the driveway, but it is close enough to serve the purpose.

Now you are wondering why would one need to beware of a white picket fence? Well, sadly, anything that is painted at some point will require a touch up or may be a complete make over! We have found that usually every seven years the fence needs a good repainting. The first time we used a steel brush to remove the old, flaking paint and it worked well. The berry bushes have been swarmed by more bees and wasps than I have encountered in the last few years, so we are hopeful for a potentially bountiful harvest of raspberries and saskatoons...
